
RLK Architect's drawing of the Minnetonka Blvd. view of the new Excelsior Bay Harbor office building.

New Building Approved

A plan by property owner Kent Carlson to demolish the former St. Alban's Boathouse restaurant and construct a new Excelsior Bay Harbor office building was approved at the May city council meeting. An office building is an allowable use in the zoning district and the project meets all city ordinances regarding surface coverage, setbacks, height, and parking. 2011 Road Projects

Each spring the city engineer gives a rating (poor to good) to all city roads. He then prepares estimates for potential projects. The city council chooses projects that best use the budget with the goal to replace or repair roads that are "poor" and to sealcoat "good" roads to extend pavement life. Priority also is placed on roads with drainage problems. Unfortunately, we cannot approve all projects due to a limited road budget and the fact that Greenwood has a policy of not charging special assessments to residents for road improvements. This year the west leg of **Greenwood Circle, Crestside, West Street, and part of Meadville will receive new pavement at a total cost of \$130,000.** Construction will begin in July and will be completed in August. Did You Know?

You can use the city's buckthorn wrench for free!

Minnesota has declared buckthorn to be a "restricted" noxious weed -- which means it cannot be sold or transported in the state. In an effort to reduce the amount of buckthorn in our area, the city has a buckthorn wrench for use by residents. Pick up the wrench at city hall (a \$50 check is required as a deposit and will be given back to you when you return the wrench). The buckthorn wrench cannot be reserved in advance, so you may want to call ahead to make sure it is available before you stop by. Thank you for helping make Greenwood beautiful!

Summer Greetings! I hope you are enjoying the sun now that it finally has arrived. In addition to approving the new Excelsior Bay Harbor building (see article on other side), here is a sampling of what your city council has been working on since my last report ...

- Approved a project to refurbish Greenwood Park.
- Walked the LRT trail with Xcel Energy officials to discuss tree removal for the 2013 improvements to the transmission line.
- Met with county assessors to ensure fair valuations for Greenwood. Our lakeshore valuations decreased by -6.2% compared to only -3.8% average for the other South Lake cities.
- Approved a cost-saving method for complying with federal street sign regulations.
