CITY COUNCIL APPROVES -.21% DECREASE FOR PRELIMINARY 2020 TAX LEVY

At the 09.04.19 meeting, the city council approved a *preliminary* 2020 tax levy of \$636,492. This is a slight -0.21% decrease from the 2019 tax levy. The public comment opportunity and *final* 2020 tax levy and budget approval will take place at the Dec 4 council meeting. According to state law, the *final* tax levy amount cannot be increased from the *preliminary* amount set by the city council.


Did You Know? Currently, Only 22 Dogs are Licensed in Greenwood!

Dogs are required to be licensed in the city. **2019-20 DOG TAGS** cost \$25 and may be purchased at City Hall or download the application at greenwoodmn.com to complete the process by mail. Proof of rabies vaccination is required.

Illicit Discharges

The city has a program to detect and prevent illicit discharges (**OIL, PAINT, FERTILIZER, PET WASTE, GRASS CLIPPINGS, ETC**) from entering the city's storm sewer system, ditches, ponds, or Lake Minnetonka. If you observe an illicit discharge, call 911. Discharges from **SUMP PUMPS** and **FOUNDATION DRAINS** into the *sanitary* sewer also are prohibited. If you observe an illicit *sanitary* sewer discharge, call City Hall at 952.474.6633.

Below is an update regarding city items of interest ...

- The council approved a slight -0.21% decrease for the preliminary tax levy (see article above). I am pleased to report we have not increased the city's tax levy since I have been mayor (10th budget in my 11 years as mayor).
- Road, sewer, and stormwater projects will finish up this fall.
- No Parking Dec 1-Apr 1 signs will be installed near the Meadville launch area to deter disruptive ice-fishing activity.
- The council approved an ordinance that requires large window wells to meet property line setbacks.
